

How to Use Camera Leather Sheet

*The "alcohol" in the text refers to 99.5% waterless ethanol



1

Put a new skin on your Olympus Trip.



2

Use tweezers to peel off the edges of the old skin, carefully as not to damage the camera casing. The peeled skin will serve as a shape mold, so be careful not to tear them apart.

Inject alcohol with a syringe into the part where the old skin was peeled off. (Makes it easier to remove the glue sticking it to the camera casing.)

Go slow and be more careful when peeling the skins on the front parts of the camera as the shape is more complicated.





2 pieces on the front, and 1 piece on the back, a total of 3 pieces of skins have been peeled off. Use these 3 pieces as the shape mold to cut the new skins.

Apply commonly available double-sided tape on the back of the old skins. Make sure the edges of the tape line up with the edges of the skin.





Peel off the release liners of the double-sided tape and put the new skins on top and apply pressure on them so that they stick, and then cut the new skins according to the shape of the old skins.





Set up a cutting mat and cut them with a sharp utility knife. Use a "cutter for camera leather & malt plane" to make it easier.

Use a hole puncher to easily make holes that can't be cut out with a knife. The skin on the bottom right shows the skin with the hole punched.

All 3 skins have been cut according to size according to the old skins. Remove the double-sided tape on each piece and stick them on the camera casing.

Make sure the holes on the skin line up with the holes on the casing when sticking them on.

Done! Change the skin on your favorite camera and take photos with a new perspective!
